

Third Party Data Request Program Fact Sheet for Local Governments

Introduction

The Third Party Energy Data Request Program is a new offering from SCE which provides access to energy usage and usage related data to eligible Third Parties (e.g. local government entities, academic researchers, and state/federal agencies).

What's Changing?

- Online submission of data requests
- New time frames for processing requests

Online Submission of Data Requests

Going forward, all data requested under this program must be submitted using the online form.

The online form is located on sce.com, and may be accessed by using the following internet address: www.SCE.com/energydatarequest. Alternatively, you may locate the online form by navigating to www.sce.com, and using the following path: > Partners & Vendors > Partnerships > Access Energy Usage Data > Click "Get Started".

SCE will post a request log online which will allow requestors to see the status of their data request.

New Time Frames for Processing Requests

Within seven days of a local government submitting an online request for data, a representative from SCE will contact the requestor to confirm that all information needed by SCE was provided in the request. If the request is incomplete, a SCE representative will contact the requestor to inform them that additional information is required.

Once SCE has received all the needed information, it will have fifteen business days to review the request to determine if SCE is able to fulfill it.

- If the request is approved, SCE will notify the CPUC Executive Director, and communicate a proposed fulfillment date to the Local Government.

IMPORTANT: SCE must wait a minimum of four weeks from the date the CPUC Executive Director is notified before the data may be transferred to the requesting Local Government.

- If the request is not approved, SCE will inform the Local Government, providing the reason(s) and/or offer other options.

Updated Aggregation Rules for Local Government Requests

Option 1: Aggregation

Residential, Commercial, Agricultural Energy Consumption Data (15/20 Aggregation Rule) For each customer class, data set must meet the following rules:

- Contain at least 15 customers
- No single customer makes up more than 20% of the total energy consumption
- Data must be aggregated either monthly, quarterly, or annually

Industrial Energy Consumption Data (5/25 Aggregation Rule) For the industrial customer class, data set must meet the following rules:

- Contain at least 5 customers
- No single customer makes up more than 25% of the total energy consumption
- Data must be aggregated either monthly, quarterly, or annually

Option 2: Anonymization

Residential, Commercial, Agricultural, or Industrial Energy Consumption Data (100/10 Anonymization Rule) Local governments may also request anonymized service account level data which must meet the following rules:

- Contain at least 100 service accounts for each customer class
- No single service account can make up more than 10% of the total energy consumption for that customer class
- Data must be aggregated either monthly, quarterly, or annually
- Data must be removed of all information that can be used to identify a customer

Things to Know

The requestor must use any data received for the purpose specified in the request, and is not permitted to share the data with another Third Party or publicly disclose the data.

Subsequent requests for data must be submitted using the online form. We are not able to accommodate requests for ongoing access to data.
