SUMMARY

Southern California Edison Company (SCE) has filed a request with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) for review of SCE's 2013 operations for certain aspects of its business. In addition, this application requests an increase in revenue to cover expenses related to two of SCE's CPUC-approved accounts. This request is referred to as the Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) review application A. 14-04-006.

ABOUT THE PROPOSAL

In this application, SCE provides information to demonstrate that during 2013:

- (1) SCE's electricity generation resources served customers in compliance with CPUC regulations;
- (2) SCE's purchased power and fuel expenses were accurately recorded in the ERRA Balancing Account; and
- (3) SCE's contract administration for the purchase and delivery of electricity and utility-retained generation operations were reasonable.

This application will also request approval to recover \$6.619 million from customers.

In 2013, two SCE accounts, authorized by the CPUC, did not have sufficient funds to cover costs (under-collected):

- (1) the Litigation Costs Tracking Account and
- (2) the Market Redesign and Technology Upgrade Memorandum Account.

Also, SCE’s Project Development Division Memorandum Account had more funds than was needed (over-collected). However, the over-collection was less than the under-collection in the two accounts discussed above. The requested \$6.619 million represents the under-collected difference between the accounts.

Compared to revenues as of March 1, 2014, this application requests a revenue increase of \$6.619 million, or 0.06%, beginning in 2015. **If the Commission should approve total rates as requested, an average residential electric customer using 600 kilowatt-hours per month would expect to see an increase of \$0.11 per month, from \$98.34 to \$98.45.** The following table shows current rates compared to an estimate of proposed revenue and rate changes by customer group.

HOW DOES THE CPUC'S DECISION MAKING PROCESS WORK?

The application will be reviewed through the CPUC's formal process. The application is assigned to a CPUC Administrative Law Judge (Judge). The Judge presides over the proceeding, which may include evidentiary hearings to give parties an opportunity to present evidence and cross-examine witnesses. Members of the public may attend but not participate in these hearings unless they are parties to the case. The hearings and documents submitted in the proceeding become part of the formal record that the Judge relies upon in writing a proposed decision to present to the five-member Commission for its consideration.

Any CPUC Commissioner may issue an alternate decision. The proposed and any alternate decisions are voted upon by the Commissioners at a CPUC meeting. The CPUC may adopt all or part of SCE's request, modify it or deny the application.
