**SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY (SCE)
NOTIFICATION OF CATASTROPHIC EVENT MEMORANDUM ACCOUNT (CEMA)
APPLICATION FILING REGARDING
PROPOSED INCREASE IN ELECTRIC RATES**

APPLICATION NO. A.13-09-016

PROPOSAL TO INCREASE YOUR ELECTRIC RATES

In compliance with California Public Utilities Code section 454.9 and California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) decisions, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) has filed a Catastrophic Event Memorandum Account (CEMA) application. This application is referred to as A.13-09-016. The application filing requests changes in SCE's electric rates due to the incremental costs associated with the restoration of service and repair of damage to its facilities resulting from the 2009 Firestorms and 2010 Rainstorms. The application requests a one-time increase in SCE's revenue requirement of \$6.774 million, or .056 percent. If approved by the CPUC in 2014, this amount will be implemented in rates as soon as practical after the effective date of the decision.

Beginning on August 25, 2009, Southern California experienced a series of severe firestorms that affected much of SCE's service territory. In particular, two major fires, Station fire and Morris fire, caused significant damage to SCE's infrastructure and operations in its service territory. The Governor issued various State of Emergency Proclamations for SCE's service territory in the affected areas due to wildfires. Additionally, in January and again in December 2010, a series of intense rainstorms caused widespread damage to Southern California's infrastructure, including SCE's distribution system in its service territory, and disrupted service to its customers. Emergency Proclamations were issued by the Governor declaring state of emergency in the affected areas due to these rainstorms. In accordance with CPUC Resolution E-3824, SCE is requesting recovery of incremental capital costs it incurred as a result of these catastrophic events through its CEMA application. Specifically, SCE is seeking for incremental costs it incurred in restoring service and rebuilding its infrastructure as a result of these events. These costs are not part of SCE's normal business and therefore are not funded through existing rates.

Compared to revenues at present rates as of June 1, 2013, this application requests a revenue increase of approximately \$6.774 million, or .056%. If the Commission should approve total rates as requested, an average non-CARE residential electric customer using approximately 600 kilowatt-hours per month would expect to see an increase of \$.08 per month, from \$114.45 to \$114.53.

CPUC PROCESS

The CPUC will evaluate and determine the reasonableness of SCE's incremental costs through its administrative law process where the proceeding is assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) who will direct the method in which the record, upon which the Commission bases its decisions, is made. The ALJ **may** hold evidentiary hearings where parties to the proceeding provide testimony and other parties may cross-examine them. These hearings are open to the public, but only formal parties of record may participate. After considering all proposals and evidence presented, the assigned ALJ will issue a proposed decision. The CPUC may approve the proposed decision as written, modify it, approve another proposal or completely deny SCE's request.
