**ADVICE 1478-E**  
**(U 338-E)**

**SUBJECT:**     **Affiliate/Subsidiary Information Pursuant to Decision**  
                  **No. 00-08-023**

In compliance with Decision No. 00-08-023 (D.00-08-023 or Decision), Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby submits for filing the Affiliate/Subsidiary information, pursuant to Ordering Paragraph No. 4 of the Decision.

**PURPOSE**

This advice filing provides the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) with the information concerning markets in which SCE affiliates or subsidiaries operate and in which SCE intends to procure electricity or ancillary services.

**BACKGROUND**

On July 21, 2000, SCE filed its "Emergency Motion Of Southern California Edison Company (U 338- E) For An Order Approving Bilateral Power Contract Transactions" (Emergency Motion). In its motion, under Rule 81, SCE requested that the Commission grant the Emergency Motion on an expedited, *ex parte* basis and issue orders that: (1) approve memorandum accounts as requested; (2) authorize SCE to enter into medium-term and long-term bilateral contracts for the purposes discussed in the Emergency Motion, provided that delivery occurs through the PX's markets; (3) find that all payments made by SCE under medium-term bilateral transactions will be deemed reasonable and prudent and recoverable in full by SCE through its Annual Transition Cost Adjustment Proceeding, or any other mechanism authorized by the Commission, provided that they are within the tolerance band described in the Emergency Motion; and (4) issue an order that allows SCE to make

compliance filings requesting pre-approval of long-term bilateral transactions, as described in the Emergency Motion.

On July 26, 2000, SCE filed an "Errata To The Emergency Motion of Southern California Edison Company (U 338-E) For An Order Approving Bilateral Power Contract Transactions" to correct inadvertent errors.

On August 3, 2000, the Commission issued D.00-08-023 which approved SCE's emergency motion with certain modifications. D.00-08-023 authorized SCE to enter into near-term and medium-term bilateral contracts that will expire on or before December 31, 2005. This Decision maintains the purchase limits already approved by the Commission for forward energy products, including capacity products. This Decision also holds SCE to the purchase limits already authorized for forward energy products, including capacity products. SCE is required to disclose all bilateral transactions to the Energy Division on a confidential basis in a monthly report.

### **SCE Affiliates and Subsidiaries**

Ordering Paragraph No. 4 of D.00-08-023 requires SCE to inform the Commission of any markets in which its affiliates or subsidiaries operate and in which it intends to procure electricity or ancillary services. SCE's electricity-related affiliates and their subsidiaries operate in the United States and International markets, including California markets. SCE intends to procure electric and ancillary services from the California markets, which may include out-of-state facilities connected to the California grid. SCE does not have subsidiaries that currently produce electricity. SCE will seek prior approval of the Commission before any proposed bilateral contract with an affiliate becomes effective.

SCE will shortly be filing a supplemental advice filing to establish the memorandum account authorized in the Decision to record costs and revenue associated with SCE's participation in Near-Term Bilateral Contracts and other tariffs impacted by the Decision.

No cost information is required for this advice filing.

This advice filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other schedule or rule.

### **EFFECTIVE DATE**

This advice filing was authorized by D.00-08-023 and is effective August 3, 2000.
