SUBJECT: Update of Advice Letter 1770-E-B, dated December 22, 2004

PURPOSE

Pursuant to discussions with staff of the Energy Division of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby resubmits a limited subset of its revised capacity position limits and capacity ratable rates that were provided in Advice Letter 1770-E-B, dated December 22, 2004. Specifically, SCE is resubmitting its revised capacity position limits and capacity ratable rates for 2005-2008, and only for SCE's 14% Direct Access scenario. SCE will resubmit the balance of the update it submitted in Advice Letter 1770-E-B as part of its March 25, 2005 long-term procurement plan compliance filing.

Because no protests were received on SCE's Advice Letter 1770-E-B, and this Advice Letter 1770-E-C is merely resubmitting a subset of SCE's request in Advice Letter 1770-E-B, SCE does not believe that an additional comment period is required. As a result, SCE requests that the Commission approve SCE's submitted capacity position limits and capacity ratable rates for 2005-2008, as set forth in the attached Confidential Appendix A, prior to January 24, 2005. This will permit SCE to employ its revised capacity position limits and capacity ratable rates in the analysis and execution of contracts pursuant to its pending electrical capacity solicitation.¹ In the event that the Commission is not able to adopt this amended Advice Letter prior to January 24, 2005, SCE requests that the Commission adopt SCE's previously submitted Advice Letter 1770-E-B, which was unopposed.

¹ SCE's pending electrical capacity solicitation is currently scheduled to receive final binding bids on January 26, 2005.
