SUBJECT: Establishment of Low-Income Assistance Program for Water
Service on Santa Catalina Island

In compliance with Resolution W-4665, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby submits for filing the following tariffs and filed forms. The revised tariff sheets and filed forms are listed on Attachment A and are attached hereto.

PURPOSE

Pursuant to the request of the Water Division, SCE amends Advice 63-W to request only the institution of a low-income assistance program, the related memorandum account, and removal of the surcharge in Schedule W-1, General Metered Fresh Water Service, as originally proposed in SCE's Advice 63-W.

In compliance with Resolution W-4665 (Resolution) authorizing a general rate increase for water service on Santa Catalina Island (Catalina), SCE proposes a low-income assistance program modeled after the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) program for electric service.¹ In addition, SCE is authorized to establish a memorandum account to track lost revenue arising from the discounted low-income rates. As such, SCE is establishing herein, Schedule W-1-CARE, Santa Catalina Island California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE); Preliminary Statement, Part N, Catalina Water CARE Memorandum Account; and water statements, Forms 14-574.W and 14-574.W.S. This advice filing supplements and replaces Advice 63-W in its entirety.

BACKGROUND

On December 9, 2005, SCE filed Advice W000144 to request authority under Section VI of General Order (GO) 96-A and Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to increase

water revenues to Catalina, a Class C water utility, by 248 percent or \$3,220,390 over 2005 revenues, for a 9.07 percent return on rate base for Test Year 2006. The purpose of the rate increase was to recover increased operating expenses and to provide an adequate rate of return on plant investment. SCE proposed that the 2006 revenue increase be phased in over a three-year period in order to mitigate the impact of this rate increase on its Catalina water service customers. SCE included a proposal to modify its existing rate design for water service on Catalina to include a third tier volumetric rate, for high usage customers, to encourage conservation of water resources.

The Resolution, issued on November 1, 2007, authorized an increase of \$2,569,390, or 198 percent relative to 2005 revenues, for an 8.77 percent return on rate base for Test Year 2006. This results in Test Year 2006 revenue of \$3,870,000. In order to mitigate the impacts on Catalina customers, the authorized revenue requirement increase will be phased in over four years from 2007 to 2010. The Resolution also adopted rates for 2007 and 2008 and approved SCE's proposal to change the current two-tier rate structure to a three-tier structure. SCE implemented authorized 2007 rates on November 15, 2007 (Advice 59-W) and authorized 2008 rates on January 1, 2008 (Advice 60-W). Ordering Paragraph 12 of the Resolution requires that SCE file an advice letter within 180 days from the effective date of the Resolution to establish a low-income program that offers a 20 percent discount for eligible Residential customers, with eligibility criteria modeled after SCE's CARE program for electric and gas service on Catalina. Ordering Paragraph 13 authorizes SCE to establish a memorandum account to track lost revenues arising from the 20 percent discount.

PROPOSAL/PROPOSED TARIFF CHANGES

Pursuant to the Resolution, SCE proposes to:

- Establish Schedule W-1-CARE, Santa Catalina Island California Alternate Rates for Energy – Domestic Water Service;
- Modify the Preliminary Statements to establish Part N – Catalina Water CARE Memorandum Account (CWCMA); and
- Modify Water Statement, Form 14-574.W.²

Schedule W-1-CARE will be applicable for domestic service to qualifying customers in permanent single-family accommodations. Service on this schedule requires the same eligibility requirements as electric and gas CARE service. A CARE application will be required for participation in the CARE program unless the customer has completed an approved CARE application for electric or gas service and is currently receiving service under Schedule D-CARE or G-1-CARE. Customers served on Schedule W-1-CARE are billed for water service under Schedule W-1 rates, less the CARE discount of

20 percent. The CARE discount will appear as a line item on the participating customers' bills.

In accordance with Ordering Paragraph 13 of the Resolution, SCE is establishing the CWCMA to track lost water revenues arising from the 20 percent discount to eligible Catalina water CARE customers. SCE will file an advice letter on March 1 of each year requesting authority to recover the lost revenues by imposing a surcharge on its non-CARE eligible customers.

The proposed new CARE schedule and revised tariffs are attached hereto as Attachment A. This advice filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other schedule or rule.

TIER DESIGNATION

Pursuant to D.07-01-024, Appendix C, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1(3), this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

PROTESTS

In accordance with D.07-01-024, Appendix A, Rule 7.5.1, "The filing of a supplement, or of additional information at the request of the reviewing Industry Division, does not automatically continue or reopen the protest period or delay the effective date of the advice letter."

EFFECTIVE DATE

This advice filing will become effective on April 29, 2008, the effective date originally requested by SCE in Advice 63-W.

N. Catalina Water CARE Memorandum Account

Purpose:

The purpose of the Catalina Water CARE Memorandum Account (CWCMA) is to track the lost revenues arising from the Catalina water CARE program. The CWCMA is established in accordance with Ordering Paragraph 13 of Resolution W-4665.

1. Entries to the CWCMA shall be made monthly by posting a debit entry to record lost revenues arising from the 20 percent discount provided to eligible Catalina water CARE customers.

Interest shall accrue monthly by applying one-twelfth of the Federal Reserve three-month Commercial Paper Rate – Non Financial, from the Federal Reserve Statistical Release H.15 (expressed as an annual rate) to the average monthly CWCMA balance. If in any month a non-financial rate is not published, SCE shall use the Federal Reserve three-month Commercial Paper Rate – Financial.

2. Disposition of CWCMA End-of-Year Balances

SCE shall submit an advice letter to the Commission by March 1st of each year for the Commission to review the operation of the CWCMA during the previous calendar year, and upon approval by the Commission, reflect the CWCMA balance as a surcharge in authorized Catalina water rate levels.

SANTA CATALINA ISLAND CALIFORNIA ALTERNATE RATES FOR ENERGY (CARE)
DOMESTIC WATER SERVICE

APPLICABILITY

Applicable for domestic service to CARE households residing in a permanent single-family accommodation where a customer meets all the Special Conditions of this Schedule. Customers who receive water service under Schedule W-1 are eligible for this Schedule.

TERRITORY

The City of Avalon, Santa Catalina Island.

RATES

Rates, as applicable under Schedule W-1, shall apply. The sum of the resulting charge, plus the applicable Service Charge, is then reduced by the 20 percent CARE discount. The PUCRF identified in Schedule UF-W is applied.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. CARE Household: A CARE Household is a household where the total gross income from all sources is less than shown on the table below based on the number of persons in the household. Total gross income shall include income from all sources, both taxable and nontaxable. Persons who are claimed as a dependent on another person's income tax return are not eligible.

For Households with more than six persons, add \$7,100 annually for each additional person.

2. Application and Eligibility Declaration: An application and eligibility declaration on a form authorized by the Commission is required for each request for service under this Schedule unless the Customer has completed an approved electric or gas service application for CARE. If a customer qualifies for CARE as an electric or gas service customer they are also eligible for Schedule W-1-CARE. Renewal of a customer's eligibility declaration will be required every two years and may be required on an annual basis. Customers are only eligible to receive service under this rate at one residential location at any one time and the rate applies only to a customer's permanent primary residence. This Schedule is not applicable where, in the opinion of SCE, either the accommodation or occupancy is transient.
3. Commencement of Rate: Eligible customer shall be billed on this Schedule commencing no later than one billing period after receipt and approval of the customer's application by SCE.
4. Verification: Information provided by the applicant is subject to verification by SCE. Refusal or failure of a customer to provide documentation of eligibility acceptable to SCE, upon request by SCE, shall result in removal from this Schedule.
5. Notice From Customer: It is the customer's responsibility to notify SCE if there is a change in their eligibility status.
6. Rebilling: Customers may be rebilled for periods of ineligibility under the applicable rate schedule.

Important information

Rotating Outages

A rotating outage is a controlled electric outage that lasts approximately one hour for a group of circuits, which is used during electric system emergency conditions to avoid widespread & uncontrolled blackouts. Each SCE customer is assigned a rotating outage group, shown on the upper part of the SCE bill. If your rotating outage group begins with the letters A, M, R, S, or X, you are subject to rotating outages. If it begins with N or Exempt, you are not. Your rotating outage group may change at any time. For more information, and to see which rotating outage groups are likely to be called in the event of a system emergency, visit www.sce.com or call (800) 655-4555.

Options for Paying Your Bill

You can pay your bill by:

- Mail
- In person at an authorized payment location
- Telephone
- Online at www.sce.com

You may call us for electronic payment options, to make payment arrangements, or for information on agencies to assist you in bill payment.

Past-Due Bills

Your bill was prepared on October 1, 2007. Your bill is due when you receive it and becomes past due 19 days after the date the bill was prepared. You will have 15 days at your new address to pay a bill from a prior address before your service will be terminated. SCE does not terminate residential service for non-payment of bills for other classes of service. Termination of electric service requires a reconnection charge. A field assignment charge may appear on your next bill if SCE visits your premises because of non-payment. If you are a residential customer, and claim an inability to pay and payment arrangements have not been extended to you by SCE pursuant to SCE's filed tariffs, you may contact the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC).

Disputed Bills

If you think your bill is incorrect, call us and speak with a customer service representative, or if necessary, with a manager. If you feel unsatisfied with the result of such discussion(s), contact the CPUC, Consumer Affairs Branch by mail at: 505 Van Ness, Room 2003, San Francisco, CA 94102; or at: www.cpuc.ca.gov, (800) 649-7570, TTY: (800) 949-9599. Include a copy of your bill, why you believe SCE did not follow its rules and rates, and a check or money order made out to the CPUC for the disputed amount. You must pay the disputed amount, or send it to the CPUC, before the past-due date to avoid disconnection. The CPUC accepts payment only for matters relating directly to bill accuracy. While the CPUC is investigating your complaint, you must pay any new SCE bills that become due.

Rules and Rates

SCE's rules and rates are available in full at www.sce.com or upon request.

Late Payment Charge (LPC)

A late payment charge of .9% will be applied to the total unpaid balance on your account if full payment is not received by the due date on this bill (except for CARE rate and state agency accounts).

Electronic Fund Transfers (EFT)

When you provide a check as payment, you authorize us either to use information from your check to make a one-time electronic fund transfer from your account or to process the payment as a check transaction. When we use information from your check to make an electronic fund transfer, funds may be withdrawn from your account as soon as the same day we receive your payment. You will not receive your check back from your financial institution, but the transaction will appear on your financial institution statement. If you do not wish to authorize an electronic fund transfer, please call the 800 number on the front of your bill.

Definitions

- DWR Bond Charge: Bonds issued by the Department of Water Resources (DWR) to cover the cost of buying power for customers during the energy crisis are being repaid through this charge.
- DWR Generation: Charges for that portion of your energy usage provided by the DWR; these are collected by SCE as an agent for DWR.
- Historic Procurement Charge (HPC): The HPC has been authorized by the CPUC to allow SCE to recover past due collections.
- SCE Generation: These charges recover energy procurement and generation costs for that portion of your energy provided by SCE. Effective September 20, 2001, your ability to enter into new contracts to purchase electricity from a supplier other than SCE is suspended by the CPUC. Customers who were taking Direct Access service or who had a signed contract prior to September 20, 2001, may switch suppliers consistent with CPUC-established rules.
- Trust Transfer Amount (TTA): This reflects the Fixed Transition Amount (FTA), chargeable to residential and small commercial customers pursuant to state law and a financing order issued by the CPUC. The TTA is the property of SCE Funding Limited Liability Corporation (LLC) and is collected by SCE solely as the servicing agent for SCE Funding LLC.
