

Microgrid Incentive Program

California's investor-owned utilities (Pacific Gas and Electric Company, San Diego Gas and Electric, and Southern California Edison) are leading the nation in launching a program to provide clean, local energy to communities that need it most.

The Microgrid Incentive Program (MIP) is a competitive grant program providing \$200M in funding to communities facing outages, power shutoffs and other events driven by climate change.

MIP Can Fund:

- Up to \$14M per community microgrid project for management, engineering and development costs, such as in front-of-the-meter batteries and clean generation resources
- Up to \$1M for interconnection related costs

Eligible Applicants

- Community-based organizations
- Local/Tribal governments
- Third-party developers

Program Goals

- Power critical services like fire stations, hospitals, etc.
- ✓ Advance climate resiliency technology
- Provide reliable energy to disadvantaged populations
- ✓ Inform future clean energy initiatives
