Open Enrollment: September 1–30, 2026



Application Deadline

- All eligible Non-MRR facilities must re-apply **September 1–30, 2026** to receive CA Industry Assistance in April 2027, 2028, and 2029.
- Enrollment opens each September with notifications sent in late August.
- Miss 2026? You can still apply in September 2027 to receive credit in April 2028 and 2029.



Compliance Audits

- Per [D.14-12-037](#), utilities are required to audit **5% of applications** every three years to verify facility eligibility.
- Selected facilities will require site visits to confirm eligibility.



New Online Portal

- SCE has launched a **new online application portal** that many customers have not yet used (<https://www.sce.com/ciac>).
- Familiarize yourself with the portal before the enrollment window opens.

CA INDUSTRY ASSISTANCE CREDIT



What It Is

A **yearly bill credit** from the State of California that helps certain industrial businesses cover costs tied to **greenhouse gas emissions** from the electricity they use. This credit won't last forever—use it now to invest in clean energy and reduce future GHG costs.



Why It Exists (AB 32)

Established under the **Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006 (AB 32)** to keep businesses in California from moving operations out of state to avoid pollution rules—a challenge known as **emissions leakage**. AB 32 directs the State to minimize leakage wherever feasible.



How It Helps (EITE)

Supports eligible **Emissions-Intensive and Trade-Exposed (EITE)** facilities by offsetting part of the GHG-related costs tied to their electricity purchases, keeping California businesses competitive.



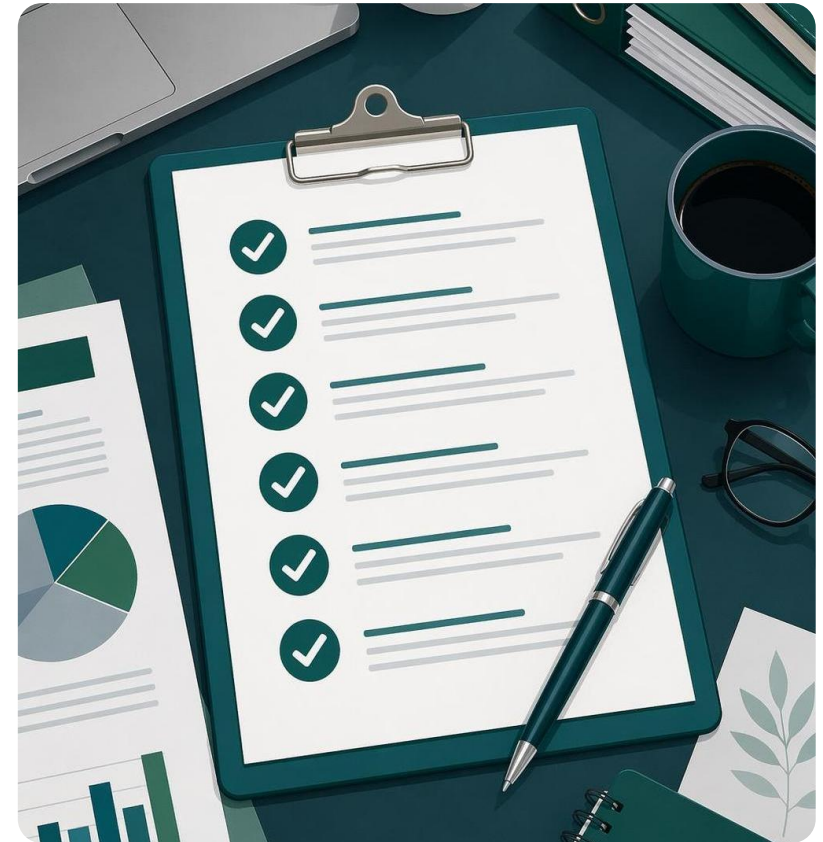
Key Dates

Southern California Edison (SCE) sends out the CA Industry Assistance Credit every **April** on behalf of the State of California. To receive your credit in **April 2027**, submit your application by **September 30, 2026**.

ELIGIBILITY

- Your facility's **primary business activity** must have an eligible three-digit North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code. Eligible business activities can be found at **sce.com/ciac**.
 - **Exception:** Crop Production facilities must match the full six-digit code 111419.
- Eligible industries are “emissions-intensive and trade-exposed” (**EITE**) — sectors at higher risk of emissions leakage.
 - **Any size business** can receive the credit.

Quick Check: Look up your NAICS code at sce.com/ciac to see if your facility qualifies.



NAICS CODE OVERVIEW



What Is a NAICS Code

A **NAICS code** is a standard number that describes what type of business your facility operates (e.g., manufacturing, food processing).



Choosing Your Code

When submitting your application, choose **the NAICS code that reflects the activity generating the most revenue** at your facility (Source: Resolution E-4716 p. 10). Visit sce.com/ciac for the full list of eligible codes.



Eligibility Requirement

Your facility must have an **EITE-eligible** NAICS code as defined by [Resolution E-4716](https://www.sce.com/ciac) to qualify for the credit. If you are not sure which NAICS Code applies to your facility, please visit <https://www.census.gov/naics/>.

TYPES OF ELIGIBLE FACILITIES

There are two types of eligible facilities:

MRR Facilities

Mandatory Reporting Regulation — already report emissions to CARB

- ✓ Eligibility auto-confirmed — just provide utility account info
- ✓ No application needed

Non-MRR Facilities

Not subject to Mandatory Reporting Regulation — do not report to CARB, but in an eligible industry

- ✓ Must complete an application form online via <https://www.sce.com/ciac> to verify eligibility



HOW TO APPLY (NON-MRR)

A separate application must be submitted for each eligible facility

Getting Started

Create an sce.com account if you don't already have one. Sign up early—the process may take a few days.

Visit the [MyAccount Registration Page](#) and select 'Register Now' under Current Customer.

Prepare

Check eligibility: Ensure your facility operates under an [Eligible NAICS Code](#).

Gather details: Note your eligible Service Account Addresses and Numbers (start with 8, found on your SCE bill).

Submit

Visit sce.com/ciac, click 'Submit Application', and log in with your SCE.com credentials.

For multiple facilities, navigate to 'Applications' by clicking your name in the top right to submit additional applications.

PURPOSE AND TRIGGERS OF REVIEW

Purpose

- Confirm that all service accounts included in the application are eligible based on their NAICS codes
- Ensure SCE's records are accurate and up to date

Triggers

- No NAICS code is on file for your facility, and you are asked to provide one during the application process
- A NAICS code is already on file, but you select a different eligible code that better represents your facility's primary business activity
- Your application is selected for audit (once per compliance period)
- Verify that the service accounts are part of the same contiguous facility

Remember: Reviews protect program integrity and ensure credits reach the right recipients. They are not intended to be burdensome.



REVIEW PROCESS AND OUTCOMES

If your application requires review, an SCE representative will:

- Confirm which service accounts are included
- Verify all service accounts are part of the same contiguous facility → non-contiguous accounts may need to be removed before resubmission
- Review each service account's NAICS code to confirm eligibility → if unconfirmed, SCE may schedule a site visit

Application Outcomes

Approved

All accounts meet eligibility requirements

Modification Required

Some accounts need removal and resubmission

Not Approved

No accounts meet eligibility requirements

CONTIGUOUS PROPERTY EXAMPLES

What is a Contiguous Facility?



A contiguous facility is any physical property or stationary equipment under common ownership located on one or more adjoining properties that share a border or are separated solely by a public roadway.

Remember:

- All Accounts at the Same Location Should Be Combined in a Single Application



CUSTOMERS WITH FACILITIES IN DIFFERENT INDUSTRIES

Facility A

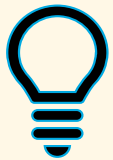
Primary activity is 311 **Food Manufacturing (Eligible)**

311 **Food Manufacturing**
3117 **Seafood Product Preparation and Packaging**
31171 **Seafood Product Preparation and Packaging**
311710 **Seafood Product Preparation and Packaging**

Facility B

Primary activity is **Refrigerated Warehousing (Not Eligible)**

- Although some processing occurs (eligible), most operations and revenue come from refrigerated warehousing (not eligible).
- The primary activity determines eligibility.



What This Means

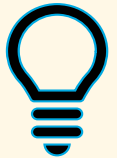
Only apply for Facility A, as it meets eligibility requirements

Important to Know

- Use the NAICS code that best represents your facility's **primary business activity** (the activity that makes up the largest share of operations or revenue).

MANUFACTURING + OFFICE

If a service account primarily supports manufacturing activities and only a small portion of the electricity is used for office space, the account may still be eligible.



What This Means

In this case, you would submit one application for the service account listed on your bill.

Important to Know

If most of the electricity load is used for office space rather than manufacturing, the service account would not be eligible.

MULTIPLE ACCOUNTS AT ONE FACILITY

A single, contiguous facility may have multiple service accounts serving different purposes.

In this example:

- Three service accounts support manufacturing activities **(eligible)**
- One service account supports office space only **(not eligible)**



What This Means



1. Only include the eligible service accounts (those supporting manufacturing).
2. Exclude service accounts used solely for non-eligible activities, such as office space.
3. Submit one application that includes only the eligible service accounts.
