# External Summary – Water Allocation Extension Policy Catalina Water Utility

Policy is subject to change and relies on the latest utility tariffs, data, constraints, and assumptions.

### Purpose:

Set forth guidelines for processing Water Allocation Extension Request(s) (Allocation Extension(s)) pursuant to SCE's water utility tariffs approved by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), specifically Water Tariff Rule 3 (Rule 3).

## **Impact and Operating Principles:**

- Allocation Extensions, while primarily benefiting the applicant, may also benefit the public and support reliable water service without adverse effects on existing customers.
- Make limited water supplies available to customers on a first-come-[first-complete]-first-served basis.
- Customers receive the same treatment.
- Customers do not game the process and/or control water [allocation] banks.

#### Applicability:

SCE's Catalina Water Utility and a water customer with an approved fresh water allocation (Allocation). An Allocation Extension becomes potentially available when a customer who has received an Allocation is unable to complete their project prior to the Allocation expiration date. Rule 3 language that is associated with this policy includes:

- Reservation of Fresh Water Allocation (Tariff Rule 3, Paragraph D.3.d.): An assigned fresh water
  allocation may be reserved for the applicant's use for a period not to exceed 18 months, unless
  further extended by SCE at its sole discretion
- **Building Permit Denials and Cancellations** (Tariff Rule 3, Paragraph D.3.e.): SCE, upon notification that the applicant's building permit has been denied, revoked, or cancelled, shall cancel the applicant's assigned fresh water allocation.
- Fresh Water Allocation Change (Tariff Rule 3, Paragraph D.3.c.): Where a change results in a greater fresh water requirement, it will result in the applicant being placed at the end of the Fresh Water Allocation List for the incremental increase beyond the initial requirement.
- Fresh Water Allocation Process (Tariff Rule 3, Paragraph D.3.a.): Applicants under the jurisdiction of the City of Avalon must obtain an authorization for consideration of a water allocation from the City.

### **Considerations:**

- **First Request** [18 months changes to 36 months]: Typically approved with reasonable justification provided by applicant and no other adverse utility impacts exist; if a legacy request, address the latest allocation plan requirements
- **Second Request** [36 months changes to 54 months]: Typically approved with reasonable justification provided by applicant, no other adverse utility impacts exist, utility plan,

Policy is subject to change and relies on the latest utility tariffs, data, constraints, and assumptions. building permit reference number, project financing secured, land rights secured, and project schedule reasonably shows completion prior to expiration; if a legacy request, address the latest allocation plan requirements

- Third or Greater Request [54 months changes to 72 months]: Typically, not approved; reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Approval criteria includes but not limited to:
  - Active construction
  - Project schedule reasonably shows completion prior to expiration
  - No other adverse utility impacts exists
  - If legacy request, address the latest allocation plan requirements
- Criteria considered for adverse utility impacts include but not limited to:
  - Customer request games the system
  - Customer request reflects a water allocation bank or prevents water from going to requests that are complete and ready
  - Water supplies are not able to achieve the production capacity in Schedule FWY or meet max day demand requirements
  - Active Stage 2+ water rationing in effect
  - Water utility conditions of service are not met; including but not limited to: project plans, utility plan, easements, extensions, upgrades, meter accessibility, unsafe apparatus, or back flow device.
  - Results are generally not in the public interest
  - Worsens fire/emergency preparedness
- Financial Security instruments may be any combination of the following<sup>1</sup>:
  - o letter of credit
  - o surety bond
  - o guarantee
  - o other form of security that is reasonably acceptable
