Nguyen, Chief Environmental and Project Review Branch Division of Hydropower Administration and Compliance, Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to Mr. James A. Buerkle, Director of Generation, Southern California Edison titled, "Plan and Schedule for Filing Surrender Application."

Dear Secretary Bose:

By letter dated January 29, 2021, the Environmental and Project Review Branch Division of Hydropower Administration and Compliance, Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (Commission or FERC) approved Southern California Edison's (SCE) proposed plan and schedule to file a surrender application for the Borel Hydroelectric Project, FERC Project No. 382 (Project) by January 31, 2023.

The purpose of this letter is to seek a three-month extension of the approved filing date of January 31, 2023, to May 1, 2023.

SCE has consulted with stakeholders from federal, state, and local agencies, tribal communities, private landowners, and the public to prepare a surrender application which includes a detailed decommissioning plan and an accompanying environmental assessment report. Additional time for consultation with several tribal communities and land management agencies is necessary to provide key feedback on the current decommissioning plan and environmental assessment. Additionally, SCE is preparing an environmental justice analysis to include in the surrender application. The additional time will allow SCE to further collaboration with the external agencies to address any comments received when SCE distributes its draft surrender application for review and comment prior to formal filing with FERC.

The request for extension has no effect on the Project's existing license, which does not expire until 2046, nor will it have any effect on Project operations. The Project has not operated since

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2017 when the United States Department of the Army Corps of Engineers, modified its Lake Isabella Auxiliary Dam for safety purposes, which required the condemnation and removal of critical Project features that provided water to the Project for power generation.

For these reasons, SCE respectfully requests a three-month extension, until May 1, 2023, to file its surrender application.
