NOTICE OF ENERGY RESOURCE RECOVERY ACCOUNT (ERRA) APPLICATION FILING IN A.13-08-022

PROPOSAL TO INCREASE YOUR ELECTRIC RATES

In compliance with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) decisions, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) has filed an Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) Trigger application. This Trigger application is referred to as A.13-08-022. In an ERRA Trigger application, SCE requests a rate adjustment when its ERRA balancing account becomes either under- or over-collected over a certain threshold. The ERRA balancing account can become under- or over-collected when SCE's rates for fuel and purchased power do not match SCE's costs for fuel and purchased power.

In this Trigger application, SCE is requesting the Commission to authorize a rate increase, because SCE's ERRA balancing account is under-collected by more than 5 percent of its prior year recorded generation revenue. If the Commission grants SCE's Trigger application, SCE's revenue requirement would increase by approximately \$806 million. The primary cause of the current undercollection is the delay of implementing SCE's requested 2013 ERRA revenue requirement in its August 1, 2012 ERRA Forecast Application, A.12-08-001. This request for rate increase is not in addition to requests submitted in SCE's 2013 ERRA Forecast Application (A.12-08-001) or 2014 ERRA Forecast Application (A.13-08-004). Assuming the Commission acts on all or part of this Trigger Application, SCE's 2013 ERRA Forecast Application, or SCE's 2014 ERRA Forecast Application, SCE will make the required adjustments to its requests in the other proceedings.

Compared to revenues at present rates as of June 1, 2013, this application requests a revenue increase of approximately \$806 million, or 6.7%, beginning November 4, 2013. If the Commission should approve total rates as requested, an average non-CARE residential electric customer using 600 kilowatt-hours per month would expect to see an increase of \$7.65 per month, from \$114.45 to \$122.10. The chart below illustrate SCE's request compared to actual current rates.

CPUC PROCESS

The CPUC will evaluate and determine the ERRA Trigger application through its administrative law process where the proceeding is assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) who will direct the method in which the record, upon which the Commission bases its decisions, is made. The ALJ may hold evidentiary hearings where parties to the proceeding provide testimony and other parties may cross-examine them. These hearings are open to the public, but only formal parties of record may participate. After considering all proposals and evidence presented, the assigned ALJ will issue a proposed decision. The Commissioners may approve the proposed decision as written, modify it, approve another proposal written by a Commissioner or completely deny SCE's request.
