NOTICE OF APPLICATION FILING TO CHANGE ELECTRIC RATES FOR THE 2019 ENERGY RESOURCE RECOVERY ACCOUNT FORECAST APPLICATION A. 18-05-003

SUMMARY

On May 1, 2018, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) requesting review and approval of its Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) Forecast Application. This application will review SCE's estimate of costs associated with certain aspects of its business operations for 2019. These costs include SCE's purchases and production of energy for its customers. SCE's application is seeking a decrease in revenue, as described further below.

ABOUT THE PROPOSAL

The CPUC has established the ERRA Forecast Application as the process for review and approval of SCE's estimate of the costs of fuel that it will need to generate electricity. This application also reviews the estimated costs of additional power it purchases for its customers. This information is provided to the CPUC for the purpose of determining SCE's rates related to the purchase of fuel and purchased power.

In addition to estimating fuel and purchased power costs, SCE's 2019 ERRA Forecast Application includes:

- (1) A request to approve other expenses recoverable in ERRA proceedings, such as expenses related to spent nuclear fuel (stored nuclear fuel that has already been used); and
- (2) A request to approve SCE's 2019 forecast of Greenhouse Gas (GHG)-related costs to be collected from customers and GHG-related revenues to be returned to customers.

SCE's proposed revenue requirement is \$4.046 billion for 2019. This request represents a decrease of approximately \$530 million from SCE's current 2018 ERRA-related revenue requirement. The revenue decrease proposed in this application will result in an average decrease to customer rates of approximately 0.2 cents per kilowatt-hour as compared to current rates. Because the GHG-related revenues that are returned to residential customers are forecast

to be lower than they were in 2018, the average residential customer's rates will not decrease.

The following table compares the impact of current 2018 ERRA rates to the forecast 2019 ERRA rates:

This application is a forecast and is likely to change prior to including these costs in next year's electric rates. Consistent with past ERRA Forecast applications, SCE expects to update this application in November 2018, so that the latest forecast assumptions can be incorporated into SCE's 2019 rates.

CPUC PROCESS

This application will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (Judge) who will determine how to receive evidence and other related documents, necessary for the CPUC to establish a record upon which to base its decision. Evidentiary Hearings (EHs) may be held where parties of record will present their testimony and may be subject to cross-examination by other parties. These EHs are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can participate.

After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned Judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt SCE's application as proposed, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

The Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) may review this application on behalf of SCE's ratepayers. ORA is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a legislative mandate to represent investor-owned utility customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. ORA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting, and engineering.
