NOTICE OF ENERGY RESOURCE RECOVERY ACCOUNT (ERRA) APPLICATION FILING IN A.13-08-004

PROPOSAL TO INCREASE YOUR ELECTRIC RATES

In compliance with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) decisions, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) has filed an Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) forecast application. This application is referred to as A.13-08-004. In an ERRA forecast application, SCE estimates the costs of fuel and purchased power that is required to generate and procure electricity for the following year, in order to set rates and recover these costs.

In this application, SCE is requesting the Commission to authorize SCE's 2014 ERRA proceeding revenue requirement in the amount of \$5.844 billion, which represents an increase of \$1.174 billion from the ERRA revenue requirement SCE requested be included in 2013 rate levels.

The ERRA proceeding revenue requirement consists primarily of SCE's estimated 2014 fuel and purchased power costs. However, it also includes: (1) one-half of the currently estimated December 31, 2013 collective balances in certain balancing accounts that SCE requests to recover from customers, and (2) other miscellaneous expenses recoverable in ERRA proceedings, such as expenses related to spent nuclear fuel.

The following table compares the rates forecast for the 2013 ERRA to the forecast for the 2014 ERRA.

The Commission has not acted on SCE's 2013 ERRA, and SCE rates have remained at the levels needed to cover its 2012 forecasts. Compared to 2012 rate levels, SCE's 2014 ERRA represents an increase of \$1.963 billion. If the Commission should approve total rates as requested, an average residential electric customer using 600 kilowatt-hours per month would expect to see an increase of \$18.81 per month, from \$114.45 to \$133.26. The chart below illustrate SCE's 2014 request compared to actual current rates.

CPUC PROCESS

The CPUC will evaluate and determine the ERRA forecast through its administrative law process where the proceeding is assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) who will direct the method in which the record, upon which the Commission bases its decisions, is made. The ALJ **may** hold evidentiary hearings where parties to the proceeding provide testimony and other parties may cross-examine them. These hearings are open to the public, but only formal parties of record may participate. After considering all proposals and evidence presented, the assigned ALJ will issue a proposed decision. The Commissioners may approve the proposed decision as written, modify it, approve another proposal written by a Commissioner or completely deny SCE's request.
