**NOTICE OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY'S FILING OF  
TWO SEPARATE APPLICATIONS THAT CHANGE ELECTRIC RATES,  
APPLICATION 17-09-018  
AND  
APPLICATION 17-09-019**

**SUMMARY**

On September 25, 2017, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) filed **two** separate applications with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) for approval to change customer electric rates:<sup>1</sup>

- 1. SCE APPLICATION TO SELL STREETLIGHT FACILITIES TO CITY OF TEMECULA (A.17-09-019); and**
- 2. SCE APPLICATION TO SELL STREETLIGHT FACILITIES TO CITY OF SANTA CLARITA (A. 17-09-018)**

In these applications, SCE proposes to sell certain electric streetlight facilities located within the Cities of Temecula and Santa Clarita to those Cities because SCE has received a reasonable offer from the Cities for its streetlight facilities. The Cities are purchasing the streetlight facilities to operate and maintain the facilities themselves rather than continuing to pay SCE for the cost of owning, operating, and maintaining the streetlight facilities. This proposal must be approved by the CPUC before the sales of the streetlight systems to the Cities of Temecula and Santa Clarita can be finalized.

**RATE IMPACT**

The sale of streetlight facilities to the City of Temecula would reduce SCE's currently-authorized base rate revenue requirement by approximately \$0.8 million, or 0.01%. This reduction would result in a **decrease** to customer rates of approximately 0.01%.<sup>2</sup> The following table shows SCE's current revenues and rates compared to an estimate of revenue and rate changes proposed in SCE's application for the sale to the City of Temecula, by customer group:

The sale to the City of Santa Clarita would reduce SCE’s currently-authorized base rate revenue requirement by approximately \$1.3 million, or 0.01%. This reduction would result in a **decrease** to customer rates of approximately 0.01%, or approximately \$0 per kWh.<sup>3</sup> The following table shows SCE’s current revenues and rates compared to an estimate of revenue and rate changes proposed in SCE’s application for the sale to the City of Santa Clarita, by customer group:

If the CPUC approves the sale of both streetlight facilities as requested, SCE’s currently-authorized base rate revenue requirement will be reduced by approximately \$2.07 million, or 0.02%. This reduction would result in a **decrease** to customer rates of approximately 0.02%.<sup>4</sup> The following table shows SCE’s current revenues and rates compared to an estimate of revenue and rate changes proposed in both applications combined, by customer group:

**CPUC PROCESS**

These applications will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge(s) who will determine how to receive evidence and other related documents necessary for the CPUC to establish a record upon which to base its decisions. Evidentiary Hearings (EHs) may be held where parties of record will present their testimony and may be subject to cross-examination by other parties. These EHs are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can participate.

After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing processes, the

assigned Judge(s) will issue proposed decisions which may adopt SCE's applications as proposed, modify them, or deny them. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor alternate decisions. The proposed decisions, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

The Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) may review these applications on behalf of SCE's ratepayers. ORA is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a legislative mandate to represent investor-owned utility customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. ORA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting, and engineering.
