The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) is holding Evidentiary Hearings regarding Southern California Edison Company's (SCE) request to review SCE's estimate of costs associated with certain aspects of its business operations for 2018. These costs include costs for SCE's purchases and production of energy for its customers.

SCE's APPLICATION FILING

The CPUC has established the ERRRA Forecast Application as the process for review and approval of SCE's estimate of the costs of fuel that it will need to generate electricity. This application also reviews the costs of additional power it purchases for its customers. This information is provided to the CPUC for the purpose of determining SCE's rates related to the purchase of fuel and purchased power.

WHAT THIS PROPOSED ERRRA FORECAST APPLICATION MEANS TO YOU

If the CPUC approves SCE's proposed ERRRA rate changes, an average non-CARE residential electric customer would see a bill decrease of \$2.36 per month, from \$107.30 to \$104.94.

This application is a forecast and is likely to change prior to including these costs in next year's electric rates. Consistent with past ERRRA Forecast applications, SCE will update this application

in November 2017, so that the latest forecast assumptions can be incorporated into SCE’s 2018 rates.

The following table shows an estimate of proposed revenue changes by customer group if SCE’s ERRA rate change is approved as requested:

CPUC PROCESS

This application has been assigned to an Administrative Law Judges (Judges) who will determine how to receive evidence and other related documents necessary for the CPUC to establish a record upon which to base its decision. At the Evidentiary Hearings, parties of record will present their testimony and may be subject to cross-examination by other parties. These evidentiary hearings are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can participate.

After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned Judges will issue a proposed decision which may adopt SCE's application as proposed, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

As a party of record, the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) has reviewed this application on behalf of SCE's ratepayers. ORA is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a legislative mandate to represent investor-owned utility customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels.
