Subject: Bishop Creek Hydroelectric Project (FERC Project No. 1394-080)

Filing of Final License Application and Request for Treatment as

Critical Energy Infrastructure Information

Dear Secretary Bose:

Pursuant to section 15(c)(1) of the Federal Power Act (FPA) (16 U.S.C. § 808(c)(1)) and the Integrated Licensing Process (ILP) regulations of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) (18 CFR § 5.17(a)), licensee and applicant Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby submits this Final License Application (FLA) for the Bishop Creek Hydroelectric Project, FERC Project No. 1394, (Bishop Creek Project) to FERC. As required under 18 CFR 5.17(d)(1), this FLA is being filed via FERC's eFiling system, with copies served to the San Francisco Regional Office, together with each resource agency, Indian tribe, and member of the public consulted during the ILP. A full Distribution List for this FLA is appended to this transmittal letter.

This FLA is submitted in accordance with FERC's ILP regulations, pursuant to the application content requirements of 18 CFR §§ 5.18 (Application Content) and 4.51 (Application for License for Major Project – Existing Dam), and consists of final technical exhibits (Exhibits A, B, C, D, F, G, and H), and an environmental report (Exhibit E). Please note that the final Exhibit F (Design Drawings), one-line diagram, and Supporting Technical Information Document contain Critical Energy Infrastructure Information (CEII).

As detailed in the FLA, SCE proposes to continue to operate and maintain the Bishop Creek Project under a new license to be issued by FERC. Exhibit E includes the results of studies undertaken in support of the relicensing. Discussion in Exhibit E considers how the information and data collected during the studies addresses issues raised by agencies and other interested parties, and how the information collected informs SCE's proposed Project operations. Following SCE's release of a Draft License Application (DLA) on January 27, 2022, relicensing participants had until May 2, 2022, to submit comments. Issues raised during this comment period are discussed in Exhibits A, B, and E, and SCE's specific responses to those comments are included in Appendix A to Exhibit E of this FLA.



SCE appreciates all comments submitted on the DLA. When evaluating these comments, SCE fully considered how the substance of the comment relates to both the information collected during the relicensing studies and SCE's proposed Project operations. In support of SCE's relicensing proposal, Exhibit E evaluates the potential impacts to environmental and social resources that may occur as a result of the proposed Project operations under a new license. As appropriate, Exhibit E includes SCE's proposals for protection, mitigation, and enhancement (PME) measures to address Bishop Creek Project effects (ongoing and proposed) on environmental and social resources.

While timely filing this FLA as required by statute and FERC regulations, SCE notes that several matters are still outstanding that will be filed at a later date, as follows:

- 1. Cultural and Tribal Resource reports have not been finalized, nor has an Historic Properties Management Plan (HPMP) been circulated for approval. SCE intends to finalize these reports and seek approval of the HPMP by August 24, 2022.
- 2. SCE and the US. Forest Service (USFS) continue to discuss the disposition of recreation facilities, and the anticipated use and need of those facilities under the new license. SCE anticipates providing an updated Recreation Management Plan (PME Measure 7, described in Appendix B of Exhibit E). SCE will provide an updated timeline to FERC for completion of this measure by August 19, 2022.
- 3. In response to the SCE's DLA, stakeholders suggested a change in operations relative to the natural hydrograph. SCE is studying this mode of operations to determine if it is operationally feasible with existing infrastructure and continues to examine the resource objectives of this measure. SCE will provide an updated timeline to FERC for completion of this measure by August 19, 2022.

As noted above, Exhibit F consists of CEII, as the detailed information contained in therein contains details about the production, generation, and transmission of power and energy at the Bishop Creek Project, which if used incorrectly, may compromise the safety of the Bishop Creek Project and those responsible for its proper operation. As such, this information is exempt from public disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act, as provided in FPA section 215A(d)(1)(A) (16 U.S.C. § 824o-1(d)(1)(A)). For this reason, each page of CEII has been marked as required by regulation (18 CFR § 388.113(d)(1)(ii)) and is being filed as a separate Volume IV of the FLA. SCE respectfully requests that FERC maintain the entirety of Volume IV in its files as non-public. Relicensing participants may seek access to the CEII contained in Volume IV as provided in 18 CFR § 388.113(g).
